Bo Gregersen honoured with Best Practice Award

Bo Gregersen received the EAIE's Best Practice Award during the Closing Event of the 17th Annual EAIE Conference in Kraków, Poland.

Bo Gregersen is the Director of Study Administration and International Relations at the Aarhus School of Business, Denmark. He has been an example of good practice in international education for many years, and his work for the Aarhus School of Business has been crucial in making it a European and international school and providing opportunities for its students and faculty. At the same time, through his longstanding involvement in EAIE in the Executive Board and several of its committees, he has been an example for EAIE members in many respects.

His valuable contributions are based on experience, a real talent for organisation and management, and a sincere commitment to the EAIE and to internationalisation. In the Nordic countries, Bo Gregersen is considered one of their most senior and respected experts, with an in-depth knowledge of the university sector in the Nordic region, of the broader financial context in which international activities take place, and a clear, but responsible and pragmatic, vision about goals and measures. In addition he is a warm, discreet, solid, a good listener - and generous when sharing experience and advice.

Best Practice Award

The Best Practice Award, which was launched during the EAIE's 2004 conference in Torino, is awarded to junior or senior practitioners in international higher education who have demonstrated good practice such as the development of a programme, an outstanding or innovative project, or an administrative breakthrough with clearly visible results. The good practice should be transferable for wider use.

Each year the EAIE conference brings together some 2000 international education professionals, who come to the conference to network and to update themselves on innovations and developments in the internationalisation of higher education.
