How to get there

By tram: From the academy venue, follow Vigyazo Ferenc Street to the Danube River. Then take tram number 2 at Széchenyi István tér in the direction of Közvágóhíd H. Disembark at Vigadó tér (second stop), and then walk along the river until you reach dock 8. The tram journey is around two minutes and the walk from the tram to the dock will take approx. six minutes.

On foot: It takes around 14 minutes to reach dock 8 on foot. Follow Nador Street until József Attila Street, turn right and keeping walking until you are at the Danube River. At the river, turn left and it's a short stroll along the river edge to dock 8.

PRACTICAL INFORMATION

CATERING

Coffee and lunch will be served in the Atrium located on the ground floor of the 13 Nádor Street (N13) building. Coffee will be served daily between 10:30–11:00 and 15:00–15:30. Lunch will be served from 12:30–13:30. To enjoy a coffee before the Academy starts, visit the café on the ground floor of the 15 Nádor Street (N15) building, which is open from 08:00. Please note that payment is required and they accept cash, credit or debit card.

You will receive a water bottle with your registration bag. This water bottle is re-usable and water stations are available throughout the venue, located near the restrooms. Tap water is safe to drink at the CEU building and everywhere in Budapest. Go green at the Academy by refilling your water bottle instead of using the disposable cups.


