JOS BEELEN, Amsterdam University of Applied Sciences, the Netherlands **Course**: Assessing internationalised learning outcomes

Jos Beelen is a researcher and consultant on internationalisation of the curriculum at the Centre for Applied Research on Economics and Management (CAREM) and Senior Policy Advisor on internationalisation at the Amsterdam University of Applied Sciences. He was the editor of the second volume of EAIE's Professional Development Series *Implementing internationalisation at home* and has since published frequently on internationalisation of the curriculum. Jos is Chair of the *Internationalisation at Home* EAIE Expert Community and cooperates closely with colleagues from Australia, South Africa and Latin America on internationalisation of curricula. He holds a Master's degree in classical archaeology from the University of Amsterdam.



MEGAN BRENN-WHITE, The Brenn-White Group, USA

<u>Course</u>: Make or break: turning prospective students into enrolled students

Megan Brenn-White is Director and Founder of The Brenn-White Group, an agency based in New York City providing marketing, strategy and editorial services that help universities reach international audiences. Megan has served as deputy director of DAAD New York, executive director of the Hessen Universities Consortium and director for international partnerships at Parsons School of Design. She has also held senior positions in global marketing and content at the websites Bolt.com, iAgora.com and E*TRADE. Megan is a frequent panellist at international education conferences and has published widely on topics related to higher education marketing and internationalisation. She received a Bachelor's degree in government from Harvard University, a Master's degree in European studies from the London School of Economics and Political Science, and has studied and worked in Germany, England, France and Israel.



NADINE BURQUEL, BCS Consultancy Services, Luxembourg <u>Course</u>: Using collaborative benchmarking to boost performance in internationalisation

Nadine Burquel is Owner and Director of BCS Consultancy Services, specialising in providing advice and expertise on EU policies and programmes in higher education. She is an expert in university governance, leadership and strategic management, as well as internationalisation, quality assurance and universitybusiness cooperation. Nadine manages numerous leadership programmes. She has contributed to several publications, reports and handbooks, and was involved in two studies on transparency tools for internationalisation. In the Erasmus Mundus programme, she was a key expert on a quality assurance project. In 2013, she led a project on joint EU-Russia degrees.



MARINA CASALS, Rovira i Virgili University, Spain <u>Course</u>: The fundamentals of building a strategic internationalisation plan

As Director of International Relations at the Universitat Rovira i Virgili (URV) in Tarragona, Marina Casals Sala is responsible for the development and implementation of the university's internationalisation strategy. Prior to this, she was head of protocol and public relations at Al Akhawayn University in Ifrane, Morocco and taught Spanish at the University of Tampere, Finland. Marina has a Bachelor's degree in translation and interpreting, a Master's degree in the teaching of second languages, and specialised training in neuro-linguistic programming (NLP) and systemic therapy. She has been a valued professional contributor to the EAIE for many years: she served on the *Strategy and Management* EAIE Expert Community Board from 2007 to 2014, was awarded the Rising Star Award in 2009 and is now a Board member of the Association.



ROBERT COELEN, Stenden University of Applied Sciences, the Netherlands <u>Course</u>: Maximising the efforts of student recruitment agents and networks (NEW)

Robert Coelen is Professor of Internationalisation of Higher Education at Stenden University of Applied Sciences. He was a university executive in this field for 18 years at four different higher education institutions, and has now turned to research to further underpin internationalisation activities in education in general. He has lived in Australia for 30 years and spent about five years in total during that time working in Asia and the USA. Robert has consulted on international marketing and positioning. He was the organiser of the Leiden University Symposia on Global Ranking of Universities. He is a regular speaker at national and international conferences on internationalisation and also publishes in the field. Robert has been an EAIE trainer previously, and has held positions in the organisation's committees, including the EAIE's Executive Board.



DARLA DEARDORFF, Association of International Education Administrators, USA <u>Course</u>: Assessing internationalised learning outcomes

Darla Deardorff is Executive Director of the Association of International Education Administrators, headquartered at Duke University. She has held several national leadership positions at NAFSA and the Forum on Education Abroad. Darla has lived and taught abroad and is faculty of the Summer Institute of Intercultural Communication in Portland, as well as other universities in South Africa, China and Japan. She has conducted cross-cultural training for universities, companies and non-profit organisations for nearly 20 years and has given talks at numerous conferences. Darla has published several book chapters and articles on international education, intercultural competence and assessment. Her intercultural competence models are used worldwide. She edited the SAGE Handbook of intercultural competence and co-edited the SAGE Handbook of international higher education and Building cultural competence: innovative activities and models, among others.

Majka Drewitz has worked at Educational Credential Evaluators, Inc. (ECE) since 1998. She is native of Poland, where she attended the University of Adam Mickiewicz in Poznan. Majka received her Bachelor's degree in English and linguistics from the University of Wisconsin. Her areas of expertise include Eastern and Western Europe, the former Soviet Union, China, Canada, India, Latin America, Syria, francophone education systems and document forensics. Majka authored *Evaluation tools for Russian credentials* and co-authored *Education in the Commonwealth Caribbean*, volume III. She has held concurrent positions as senior evaluator and research & knowledge management evaluator for several years. She is Editor of the news section of *The Connection* online forum for international credential evaluation professionals. Majka has presented at a number of conferences and delivered numerous on-site and e-learning training programmes.

JOACHIM EKSTRÖM, Uppsala University, Sweden

Joachim Ekström has worked at Uppsala University since 2003, where he is currently responsible for the strategic development of international marketing and communications. He is also the elected Chair for the Marketing and Communication group within 'Study Destination Sweden'. Before joining the university, he worked in B2B marketing in the life sciences industry gaining experience in different facets of marketing such as brand development, product launches and production of sales tools and websites. He is now focused on the development of practical communication models suitable for an academic environment – which in many ways differ from the business world. He is especially interested in the incorporation of new technological opportunities that can be used to promote research and recruit students and employees in an increasingly competitive international context. He is Vice Chair of the EAIE Expert Community *Marketing and Recruitment*.



CECILIA GEORGE, The Swedish Council for Higher Education, Sweden <u>Course</u>: The credential evaluator's toolkit: tour of sub-Saharan Africa (NEW)

Cecilia George has been Senior Credential evaluator at ENIC-NARIC Sweden since 2006 and is an expert in education systems from Anglophone Africa, Southeast Asia and Western Europe. She additionally develops evaluation methodologies and introductions for new evaluators. Cecilia has a professional background in international admissions. She has been a speaker and workshop organiser at several conferences through the EAIE, the ENIC-NARIC Network and Taicep. Her focus as a speaker and trainer has been on the recognition and evaluation of credentials from Africa, the recognition of refugee credentials and IT tools for recognition. Fiona Hunter is Associate Director at the Centre for Higher Education Internationalisation (CHEI) at Università Cattolica del Sacro Cuore in Milan and Co-editor of the Journal of *Studies for International Education*. She is a consultant and trainer in higher education, working globally with public, private and faith-based higher education institutions principally in the areas of strategic change and internationalisation. She holds a Doctorate of Business Administration in higher education management from the University of Bath.



ELSPETH JONES, Leeds Beckett University, United Kingdom <u>Course</u>: The keys to an extraordinary international student experience

Elspeth Jones is an Emerita Professor of internationalisation of higher education in the UK and an international education consultant. She has worked in international education for 35 years on six continents. Her specialisations include strategic leadership for internationalisation, internationalisation of the curriculum at home and abroad, employability outcomes from internationalisation and intercultural competence development. Elspeth has been published widely, is a member of the Editorial Board of the *Journal of Studies in International Education* and series editor for the new Routledge book series *Internationalization in Higher Education*. She is a member of the Scientific Committee and Honorary Visiting Fellow of the Centre for Higher Education Internationalisation (CHEI) at the Università Cattolica del Sacro Cuore. Elspeth is Visiting Professor at the University of Zagreb and Edge Hill University, and is Chair of the Board of Directors of NCUK.



KARIN KLITGAARD MØLLER, EDU, Denmark

Course: Facilitating cultural learning in education abroad

Karin Klitgaard Møller is Manager of Student Advising and International Relations at EDU, an agency representing international universities in the Danish market and offering comprehensive support to Danish students looking for international study opportunities. She has worked in the field of international education for more than 14 years and was previously head of internationalisation at the Faculty of Life Sciences at the University of Copenhagen. Prior to that, she was in charge of the section for incoming students at the University of Copenhagen's International Office. She has been an EAIE trainer since 2006, and served as Chair of the *Mobility Advising* EAIE Expert Community from 2004 to 2012. Karin also previously served as a member of the Conference Programme Committee and currently serves on the EAIE General Council.



HANS-GEORG VAN LIEMPD, Tilburg University, the Netherlands <u>Course</u>: The fundamentals of bulding a strategic internationalisation plan

Hans-Georg van Liempd has been the Managing Director at the Tilburg School of Social and Behavioural Sciences at Tilburg University since November 2014. From 2010 until 2014 he served as (Vice-) President of the EAIE. He was Chair of the Editorial Board of the *Internationalisation of Higher Education Handbook* and co-editor of the EAIE's 25th anniversary publication, *Possible Futures: the next 25 years of the internationalisation of higher education*. As Immediate Past President, he is currently a member of the EAIE General Council. In the past, he held several positions at Tilburg University including that of director of the international office, senior programme manager for internationalising the campus and corporate social responsibility, and director of strategy & policy. He participated as an expert on international strategy in a one-year project for the Romanian government for internationalising the strategy of 21 Romanian universities.



INEZ MEURS, Ziggurat, Netherlands

<u>Course</u>: How to run your summer school successfully

Inez Meurs is Director of Ziggurat, a consultancy company specialised in internationalisation of higher education. She previously worked at the University of Applied Sciences in Utrecht as lecturer, project leader and programme director. Inez was National Programme Manager for the OECD project on Assessment of Higher Education Learning Outcomes. She coauthored the *EAIE Professional Development Series for International Educators Managing an international office*, as well as *International Summer Schools*, and contributed to *Internationalisation at Home* and *Project Management*. Michael Paige is Professor of international and intercultural education in the Department of Organizational Leadership, Policy and Development at the University of Minnesota. A professional educator for over 45 years, his expertise is in the areas of international education and internationalisation, with an emphasis on study abroad and intercultural education/training. An active researcher, Michael also contributed to the *Maximizing study abroad guidebooks*, a series that provides strategies for language and cultural learning, as well as the research study *Beyond immediate impact: study abroad for global engagement* and CIEE's *The Transformative Power of Study Abroad* projects. He has edited and co-authored numerous volumes.



ADRIANA PEREZ ENCINAS, Universidad Autónoma de Madrid, Spain <u>Course</u>: The keys to an extraordinary international student experience

Adriana Pérez Encinas is Lecturer and Researcher in internationalisation of higher education at the Universidad Autónoma de Madrid (UAM), where she was previously head of the International Relations Office in the Faculty of Business and Economics. Adriana has a Master's degree in international relations with Latin America and a Bachelor's degree in translation and interpreting. She has worked in the field of international relations for more than eight years. As the National Representative of Spain and President of the Erasmus Student Network at UAM, Adriana has contributed to international and national workshops and conferences on student mobility and recognition problems for Erasmus.



CHRIS PRICE, Adventus Education, United Kingdom <u>Course</u>: Maximising the efforts of student recruitment agents and networks (NEW)

Chris is Director and CEO at Adventus Education. He has over 20 years of experience in internationalisation, marketing and recruitment. He has gone 'full circle' in his management and leadership experience, having worked for several higher education institutions, a media agency and as CMO of a student recruitment agency.
