FROM THE EAIE BOARD

2022 started off with cautious optimism for the EAIE as well as the international education community. In the aftermath of two difficult pandemic years, there were high hopes that our community would be able to meet again in person. It was our task to find the right balance between continuing and nourishing the EAIE's online activities and services and making sure that our community's long-awaited reunion in Barcelona would exceed all expectations. The war in Ukraine and its wide impact on the country's population and infrastructure, including its higher education system and community, prompted the sector to start initiatives and send support wherever it was possible. The EAIE joined many of these initiatives, offered free membership to colleagues from Ukrainian universities and provided a platform for discussion and connection online and at the EAIE Conference and Exhibition in Barcelona.

NAVIGATING COMPLEX ISSUES

The 2022 events calendar kicked off with the Community Summit: Navigating change with purpose with more than 500 participants, it was a moment where our community could come together and discuss, reflect and provide support to the Ukrainian education community after the Russian Federation's invasion and subsequent war in the country. The spring months continued with a focus on how our community and the sector at large can support and help our Ukrainian colleagues. The EAIE set up a Ukraine resources page on its website and organised webcasts, a webinar and an Ideas Lab on the topic with guests and speakers from Ukraine.

The EAIE Online Academy continued its successful run with courses on Virtual Exchange, credential evaluation, and summer school programmes among the topics. Participants were eager to share their satisfaction with the high quality of the courses, the level of in-depth expertise of the trainers and the interesting interactive exercises during the two-day modules.

The spring months were a busy time for the EAIE, with several important events taking place. The 2022 Elections resulted in a newly elected group of volunteers who will be leading the EAIE for the next two years. The 2020–2022 EAIE Volunteer cohort had their first in-person meeting at the Joint Leadership and Volunteer Meeting in Barcelona. This two-day gathering allowed all governance bodies to plan, strategise and network in person for the first time since 2020.

THE COMMUNITY TOGETHER IN FULL COLOUR

As the year progressed into the summer months and registration for the EAIE Conference and Exhibition in Barcelona opened, there was a buzz and excitement in the air – finally, the international higher education community will be together again under one roof.

More than 6400 participants gathered in Barcelona for four days of sessions and networking at the EAIE Conference and Exhibition. This year's theme, "The future in full colour", highlighted key issues in internationalisation and the opportunities available to create a better future for generations to come. It was also a playful reference to the excitement of seeing each other in person, in full colour. The Opening Plenary keynote speaker, Yalda Hakim, a seasoned broadcast journalist for BBC World News, spoke passionately about her experience reporting from disaster zones, particularly Afghanistan. Her speech shed light on the challenges faced by young women and children in the region. The organisation and financial success of the conference and exhibition after two years of no physical events was a great result and a welcome reward for all the hard work of the volunteers and staff.

The war in Ukraine was a significant topic of discussion during the conference, and many sessions and discussions focused on supporting colleagues and students affected by the conflict. Ukrainian higher education institutions were collectively awarded the EAIE Award for Excellence in Internationalisation for their brave efforts during the war. The EAIE Exhibition provided them with a platform to connect with the wider community and receive the support and assistance necessary to remain resilient, recover, and eventually rebuild.

The Closing Plenary speaker, Jimmy Nelson, an Indigenous peoples photographer, gave an inspiring speech on our common humanity, concluding the week's events. The Plenary also served as the platform for the EAIE Presidential handover. Outgoing President Michelle Stewart passed the EAIE torch to Incoming President Piet Van Hove, who then introduced the newly elected EAIE Board, including the new Vice-President, Sara Lopez Selga, in a festive ceremony.

GREEN GOALS AND ASPIRATIONS

Sustainability was a top priority at the conference, with thousands of participants from all over the world gathering to discuss this crucial issue. The EAIE recognised the environmental impact of the event and made conscious and responsible choices to reduce it. A collaboration with CANIE began this year, with plans for a more extensive partnership in the future. The EAIE was one of the first signatories of the CANIE Accord, demonstrating its commitment to green travel and sustainable internationalisation. Some participants even travelled to the conference by train, setting a great example for others to follow.

The EAIE also pledged support to SDG 13 Climate Action, in addition to its existing commitments to SDG 4 Quality Education and SDG 12 Responsible Consumption and Production. Lastly, Spring Forum focused exclusively on "Our changing climate," featuring articles on possible paths towards sustainable internationalisation.

FINDING ALLIES IN DIFFICULT TIMES

While recognising the difficult times that parts of our community are going through once again, it is encouraging to see that individuals and organisations from the sector are willing to step up, find solutions and support those in need. That is why the EAIE aims to continue to provide a platform for the community's diverse needs and voices through webcasts, podcast episodes, blog articles, snapshot surveys and more. The EAIE is a place to find your community and enrich your professional life with close connections with like-minded people that form the core of our shared humanity. The EAIE is also actively committed to collaborating with trusted partners on issues of shared interest and activities that allow for mutual learning and benefit.

The EAIE Board with the support and commitment of the General Council, Committees, Expert Communities and Office staff, helped guide the EAIE through a transitional year tackling complex issues and finding a balance between online and in-person interactions. We were only able to accomplish our many milestones this year with the support of the ever-enthusiastic EAIE community.






